



Success has no bounds if the aim is higher

Greenwich University (GU): Have you entered entrepreneurship by choice, by luck or by accident?

Nilofer Saeed (NS): Choice: my children had grown up; my husband was in PIA, so I had all the time in the world, I didn't want to sit doing nothing so I made the most of this opportunity.

> Luck: This was because my brother and father were already in the hospitality industry. Since childhood this was the only business I was exposed to. And also when I got into this business, it was the right time, the right place and all the right reasons to become a part of this new upcoming culture.

G U: Is there any particular reason for doing the food business?

NS: As I mentioned earlier, my father had already been in this industry so I had an upper hand. And the most important reason was that my children were about 13 at that time, and they wanted a place to go out. They needed a place where they could all go out sit, hang around, and not worry. At that time the only good eating places were the 5-star hotels. I wanted to break that cycle because they were too

expensive and children couldn't be themselves in that environment. Therefore I found the food business more appropriate and decided to start a trend.

G U: Who are your inspirations in both personal and professional lives?

NS: I would like to be Martha Stewart of Pakistan. Having the image that she has which symbolizes care and nurturing, being a woman such traits are inborn and would like to maintain that.

Personally: My father. I have always been exposed to the hard work he put in which gave me the drive to do better. My family has always been very supportive for everything that I've done so far and it is because of their blind faith in me that I've been able to achieve so much.

G U: How have you as an entrepreneur been coping with financial crisis?

NS: By cutting down on my own profits. There's a certain margin that the food business is supposed to make, from 20-22%. The general economic depression of the customers made them cut down

on their luxuries, because of electricity, fuel and basic price increments. Those who would come 4 times a month would only come twice. Therefore I minimized my profits and kept the prices low so I would not lose my customers. I compromised on my profits to maintain my business because this was my livelihood. Keep prices low and make money on the volume, is what I believe in.

G U: What do you think are the key factors for a business to prosper?

NS: Honesty, integrity, and invention. Bringing something new to the consumer is very important. You don't have to be a copycat; bring something new to the market, and be a leader. Work honestly, don't cheat those who make your livelihood. Be at the right place at the right time. Starting from Copper Kettle, I introduced a new place where kids could hang around without having their mothers worry about the kind of people they will be around. I introduced the concept of bakery inside a restaurant; people liked my dessert, so I kept a variety to meet needs.

G U: Tell us about the challenges and difficulties you faced or face as a woman entrepreneur?

NS: It was actually quite the opposite. It was more of an advantage for me to be a woman, since I had almost all male colleagues, and I would get immense respect for being the first of my kind. I faced more challenges as an entrepreneur, because one has to go through that struggle called experience to be more seasoned in what the business is, but as a woman I always had my advantages. It was probably easier for me to do things being a woman as compared to any male. Once you have the confidence to come out with your mind, there's no gender bias.

G U: Is entrepreneurship an inborn talent or an art that can be learnt?

N S: It's somewhat inborn, because to be an entrepreneur you have to be a risk taker and taking risks is an art that can be learnt. When doing Hob Nob, Copper Kettle, or Necos, there were certain challenging situations where risk had to be taken, so everything I learned over time came handy and I applied those to take the well sort out risk. I have always had it in me to take risks and face challenges, but then again learning is all the more important at every step.

G U: Please tell us about TCF and its role in building and educating society and your role in it?

NS: My business is my business, it is my passion, that's



where I earn from. 15 years ago 5 gentlemen put their money together and opened 5 schools. They invited me and about 20 other people to see the school and said they wanted to set up a fund raising wing. I set that up, all over Pakistan by creating awareness, presentations, and generating funds. I was the first woman taken on the board which reinforces my point that it's not gender bias.

G U: What does TCF do apart from education?

NS: Our motive is not to only just give them education but good upbringing. Not just an educated society is what we aim for instead we want them to become better people and do good collectively as compared to being saturated. We keep religion, cast and regional associations aside and work collectively on good character build-up so that our society becomes stronger.

G U: How do you fulfill your corporate social responsibility?

NS: Well my corporate social responsibility is fulfilled after I work 18 hours out of 24 for a charitable organization, that's my corporate social responsibility. I give time and hard work into making my country and under privileged children more successful.

G U: How often do you come around celebrities at your work place?

NS: I don't think there is any celebrity or famous politician out there who has not been here at Copper Kettle. We have had almost about everyone since it was the first of its kind, it caught the eye of many. And slowly and steadily it made me into somewhat of a celebrity too.



G U: Do you approve of the shisha culture?

NS: I strongly disapprove of any social activity which involves health hazards. I have kept the smoking section separate at CK. I don't approve of shisha as it makes the environment of the restaurant bad and attracts bad crowd. I want to make it such a place where mothers would be comfortable letting their children go and not worry.

G U: Can you give message for the youth?

NS: Work hard, and play less. Once you've worked hard enough you'll have plenty of time to play. Be honest to yourself and be honest to others. There is nothing we don't have here in Pakistan, We should try looking for the right thing and collectively work together to make this country prosper.

Communication lies at the heart of E-commerce and Community

Dr Farrukh Aslam of Coventry University, UK, addressing the students of Greenwich University as a guest speaker emphasized the need to adopt the fast and rapidly growing advance technology for the growth and development in any field. E -commerce is the term that is used when any kind of electronic commerce takes place on the internet. As one of the most regulated and important parts of the internet, it covers various aspects such as website activity, emails, buying, selling and advertising goods.

Businessmen now understand the power of using the internet for advertising their business, both locally and globally, and can open up lots of new business opportunities. E-commerce allows the buying and selling of every kind of service online. However, it does have slight issues about legislation. For example, when e-commerce has led to trading between countries it can create problematic cases if a dispute arises. Trying to protect consumer interests as well as the business contract can often prove difficult, he added.

The most common type of problems are usually to do with the goods never arriving or arriving damaged. This is where questions about who should be held liable can become very troublesome. There are some regulations that assist with making e-commerce disputes between sellers and buyers easier. Some legislation associated with e-commerce regulates the use of the internet for any kind of commercial services. Dr Furrukh Aslam further said that the Electronic Commerce Regulations 2002 have been put in place to govern the rules of business online in Europe. The aim of the regulation is to boost consumer confidence in online buying. The e-commerce regulations state that any business selling a product online is regulated by its home country's commercial laws. This means that a dispute will always be settled by the laws in the country of the seller. However, this can cause serious problems for the buyer. Although it is possible for a nation to overrule the Country of Origin principle and use its own laws against a supplier in another country for these reasons.

He said that communication plays a pivotal role in the success of E-commerce, the more the communication is effective, the more growth in the business.

He concluded by saying that Pakistan has bright prospects for rapid growth of E-commerce since a very large segment of people have access to internet.

The lecture was followed by question-answer session.

Modern Tools and Methods in Business Research

Recognizing the need to know the basic business research tools is not limited to libraries and researchers at Greenwich University. All academicians, research scholars, information professionals need to research at times in a company or industry, to use the standard economic indicators, tackle a market research project discuss or talk about their personal experiences to create awareness and make the inexperienced realize how to tackle with issues. To the inexperienced, the volume of resources is intimidating.

Therefore, keeping in view the broad spectrum of research, a guest speaker session was organized that introduced the modern research methodologies and the best business tools.

Our esteemed guest speaker was Mr Faiz Muhammad Shaikh, Assistant Professor at SZABAC Larkana.

His lecture shed light on adopting different ways and using the tools to perform market research, which are: surveys, focus groups, personal interviews, observation, and field trials. He shared how data can be collected and how much money can be invested determining which techniques have been chosen for business. He stressed on the fact that with concise and straightforward questionnaires, the sample group that represents the target market can be analyzed and the larger the sample, the more reliable will be the results.

It was a good learning experience for all those who attended the lecture. A healthy and interactive discussion took place between the guest speaker and the audience.

Advocacy of Sexual Health Awareness and Education



There was more conversation, some statistics, and summaries on the slides. She came up with a few talking points, and one could tell nothing was problematic, as the speaker Ms Fiza Salim especially flew in to present at Greenwich University on March 21,2012. She is a Graduate in Development Studies from the Institute of Development Studies in Brighton, United Kingdom.

She started by talking about what work she had done in sexual health and how and why she got interested in it which led to the work she did with the clinical component at Aahung, training doctors from all over Punjab and capacity building work with the youth component at Aahung, a pilot testing publications.

Her research on minor marriages, and her findings were interesting as it pointed out some of the similarities people find across Muslim cultures.

She explained why she chose to talk about sexual health and education in particular; how it's important for young people to advocate for sexual rights, to focus on choice,



to take a more holistic approach towards dealing with issues such as homosexuality and abortion. She explained that her talk is for the purposes of knowledge sharing, for advocacy, and also to give students an idea about the kind of issues they can get involved with. Further she moved on to talk about what the situation of sexual health education in Pakistan is today, and then moved on to talk about some of the negative repercussions.

Also she talked about why sexual education is so important as it so naturally unfolds. She concluded by making some recommendations on the way forward, and some of the things which we need to keep in mind are: how it's important to take a balanced approach when talking about sexual health in Pakistan, how religion makes a significant difference to the way people process information about sex/sex-ed, and how the most effective way to bring about change is to engage in dialogue, as opposed to dismissing opinions we do not agree with.



Making a difference with Books Shiraz Haider Director Sales (South) OUP

Greenwich University (GU) Could you briefly tell us about your job?

Shiraz Haider (SH): I am Regional Sales Director, Southern Region We have 3 major regions in Pakistan: Sindh, Baluchistan and KPK. Sindh is our biggest region and I also run the antipiracy wing. Piracy is amongst the biggest threats that our industry faces. There are different approaches that are taken towards piracy. One is law enforcement, this is where we file civil suits and use the law enforcement agencies to counter the piraters. The second approach is awareness through press, media and seminars. On our own we have come up with a few techniques that out of which every book of OUP has an identification label which keeps it from being differentiated from pirated books. Urdu bazaar is the hub of books in Karachi, there are both good and bad people there. Piraters find complete freedom to practice their deviant art there.

G U: How does Oxford University Press (OUP) deal with the current rate of inflation causing people to resort to cheaper pirated books as compared to highly priced original books?

SH: Firstly it's a misconception; prices are more or less the same. The key player in this issue is the middle man. The middle man regulates how much profit to make out of which book sowing a bias in the people's mind. OUP is

constantly working on strategies in a third world country like Pakistan to keep the costs minimized.

G U: What challenges have you faced during your career and how did you cope with them?

SH: The biggest challenge I faced or any sales director in this industry would face is to operate in a country like Pakistan where to sell a literacy product can be very difficult. Even though the literacy rate is very low in Pakistan, OUP is doing exceptionally well.

G U: What characteristics should one possess in order to supervise a sales team? And what would you counsel students who want to make their career in sales?

SH: Firstly, any individual supervising any team should be passionate about his work. He must be motivated and should hold within the spark of selling. Being a sales personnel the job requires you to be very interactive therefore every individual's ego should be willing to be compromised. I personally use the 'Carrot and the Stick' formula. This is how I encourage my team and interact with them and pull the reigns when needed. Therefore as a supervisor of a sales team you should be both interactive and strict when time arises. Sales is a challenging field. A fact which many youngesters are not aware of is that 50% of all the CEOs have risen from the sales department.

G U: In a society where people do not have a reading habit, how difficult is it to sell a book?

SH: Pakistan is amongst the countries with the lowest literacy rates in the world. A person is considered literate if he can sign his name, so in such a society it can be really challenging. We are currently running programs which literate the society and engage the society and inculcate reading. There was a festival held in Karachi known as Karachi Literature Festival organized by OUP. This was where world reputed authors came and discussed their works. Such programs not onlycreate awareness within the youth but even in those illiterate underprivileged individuals.

G U: Who are your competitors in the market and how do you have an edge over them?

SH: The market is divied into 2 segments. First is local publisher and second is importers. The local publishers are known as Gava and Rebber. Famous importers consist of McGrawhill, Penguin, Puffin, Mcmillan and Pie. The only way we have an edge over these publishers is that of our name OUP which is world known and it's got 70 major branches around the world.

G U: How do you keep yourself updated about latest trends in your field? And do you believe in learning by experience or do you believe in reading and training?

SH: It is very important to keep up with trends. Right now the current trend is of digitilization. E readers are at their peak so the books have to be digitilized in order to meet

the market demand. Readers such as ipad and kindle have brought us to a point where we have to meet the digitilzation trend.

G U: Does OUP offer internship opportunities to students?

SH: Of course it does. We run an internship program annualy in the months of june and july. Currently we are in the process of shortlisting interns. The students have to give in their CVs and we conduct interviews and



shortlist them.

G U: Would you like to share any memories from Greenwich?

SH: I graduated in 1999. At that time Greenwich used to be very active. Concerts and seminars were frequent. The only memory I can recall is being in Sir. Ahsan Durrani's class and how he used conduct his classes strictly.

G U: Who was your role model in life?

SH: I don't follow anybody but I truly admire certain individuals that have come across in my life. Mr. Amir Pasha who used to be my sales manager in American Express happened to possess a personality which I truly admire.

G U: What is your message to the youth?

SH: Read other than text books, particularly history books because they open minds, and participate in debates actively.


TURNITIN TRAINING TO TEACHERS AND TEACHING ASSISTANTS

Alongwith permanent faculty & supporting staff even visiting faculty members were trained through proper workshops for the usage and implementation of "Turnitin". Every teacher was bound to attend at least three hours of training and all the relevant material was provided on University's main website for ready reference. It has been great success and almost all the teachers were able to successfully understand and implement the same in their regular classes.

Another great step is the launch of Post-Graduate Diploma in Teaching and Research (PGD T & R). Under this program enrolled students have been appointed as Teaching

The Speakers at the conference were Dr Farooq Aziz, Professor of Economics at Urdu University; Mr Amir Feroz



Shamsi, Associate Professor, Bahria University; Mr Tariq Mehmood, Assistant Professor, MAJU; Mr Muhammad Faraz, Assistant Professor, Bahria University. Shah Nawaz Ali, Assistant Professor, Iqra University, and Ms Farina Rizvi, an Entrepreneur who is also an M. Phil Scholar.

A total of 13 research papers were presented by the guest students, 3 were from Iqra University, 3 from IIHE, 2 from Bahria University, 1 from Urdu University, 1 from Karachi University, 1 from MAJU and 2 from Greenwich University. Apart from these papers, over 40 were presented by the graduating batch of Greenwich University students.

The research topics varied from topics such as satisfaction level to harmful levels of aspartame in soft drinks and aided in increasing the students' knowledge on topics of varying nature.

The graduating batch of Greenwich University then presented their research papers and theses to the panel. 




