

Greenwich University Celebrates Pakistan's 68th Independence Day



The speech competition in English went to **Abad Mehmood**, first **Noreen Safdar**, second and **Maria Sami** third. In Urdu the prizes went





Dr Rizvi and his team have rendered their unwavering, persistent and devoted efforts to serve humanity. He is highly praiseworthy and renowned for his benevolence and tolerance for the welfare of the society. Indeed, an eminent name performing a phenomenal and promising job only for the sake of ailing humanity, who does not demand any praise.

The seminar titled **Public Awareness Seminar on Transplantation** was organized by the students of Mass Communication & Media Studies Department Greenwich University Karachi as their final project under the supervision of their course in charge **Ms. Tahira Tariq**. This seminar was held in collaboration with Sindh Institute of Urology Transplantation (SIUT) on Wednesday, 24th September, 2014 at Agha Hassan Abidi Auditorium, Dewan Farooq Medical Centre SIUT Karachi.

During initial meeting with SIUT officials, it was revealed that a short film on deceased organ donation is already produced by Hum TV. A short film was required to be produced on living organ donation so both aspects of organ donation could be covered. It was a big challenge

and at the same time a great opportunity to display our students' work. The challenge was accepted and the first group produced **Pashtawa**.

Our second group collected donations from students of Greenwich University who by cutting their personal and canteen expenses donated a handsome amount to SIUT.

Our third group was very lucky to get an early suitable date before their final examination from the busy schedule of Dr. Adeeb Rizvi for Public Awareness Seminar and screening of films.

The seminar started at its scheduled time with the recitation from Holy Quran by Dr. Nasir Luck of SIUT. It was well attended by faculty members, students and general public.

A very impressive welcome address and introduction of SIUT was given by **Professor Dr. Adeeb Rizvi** director SIUT. According to him four decades ago SIUT started its journey as an eight bed ward in Burns Unit of Civil Hospital Karachi. In 1991 it was granted the status of an Institute. In 2005 was created as a charitable trust for the benefit of the public aiming to provide medical facilities and financial assistance to those who are at the end stage of renal diseases. SIUT is located in the vicinity of Civil Hospital of Karachi with its hub of activities taking place at Dewan Farooq Medical Complex. With 500 beds and





facilities spread over 400,000 sq ft. at its Karachi hospital, SIUT is regionally one of the most well equipped center for renal diseases and transplantation.

Professor Ejaz Ahmed of SIUT discussed the Transplantation topic. According to him each of us can save lives or help as many as 50 people by donating organs and tissues from our body. He explained that there are two types of organ donation. First is the deceased organ donation in which organs of a clinically dead person are transplanted. Second is living organ donation in which a person donates his organs to a patient whose organs have failed due to some illness. In Pakistan an estimated 100,000 people die each year due to end stage organ failure. This figure includes 25,000 patients with kidney failure, 50,000 with liver and 10,000 with heart failure. The main reason for majority of these cases is the want of an organ donor. While there is hope for patients with kidney failure due to availability of living donors, the answer for patients with end stage liver, heart or pancreas failure is deceased organ donation. He described organ donation as a life saving medical process.

Sultana Siddiqui, director of Hum TV productions, stressed the need for organ donation and urged our young generation to come forward to donate organs. She praised the efforts of students and Greenwich University for producing short film Pashtawa.

Dr. A.Q. Mughal, Research Professor of Greenwich University stressed the need for organ donation and according to him millions of family members are suffering and thousands of patients are living a miserable








Panel of SIUT Doctors during the question answer session:

In his current role he is working as the Regional Head of Business Solutions South for Telenor Pakistan and looks at the entire portfolio of services ranging from GSM, devices, IT as well as new and upcoming products.

Imran leads a team of more than 50 individuals in a region that spans from Quetta to Dharki. Prior to this he was serving as the VP for Corporate Sales For Cybernet, and Head of Sales for RapidCompute, both part of the illustrious LAKSON Group of Companies. Mr. Khan led the strategy and product development component at Cybernet and aided in the development of policies and procedures for the newly developed unit.

He was responsible for taking the units to record sales growth over his 4 year tenure and succeeded in positioning RapidCom

pute as the premiere leading Public Cloud Computing Service in Pakistan.

Prior to working for Telenor, Mr. Khan was the Director Sales and Marketing Centre-X Solutions, which was technology startup built with partnerships with leading international IT service providers and oversaw all communications and sales activities for international and local customers. While serving as the Assistant Vice President for CubeXS Weatherly, an AT&T company, Mr. Khan managed and developed the marketing and sales strategies that lead to industry leading account acquisitions and innovative new product developments. Mr. Imran Khan managed the communications strategies and pricing analysis for Maersk Line, a leading shipping company. Mr. Khan received both his Masters of Business Administration in Marketing and a Bachelors of Science from Greenwich University in Karachi, Pakistan with distinctions and a holds multiple deans list honors.

Greenwich University (GU): Tell us about your job?

Imran Khan (I K): I am Telenor Pakistan's Regional Manager - South (Sindh & Baluchistan Provinces) for Corporate & SME Sales. Telenor Pakistan (with a current subscriber base of 35 million within 10 yrs in Pakistan) is 100% owned by the Telenor group which is among the Largest Mobile Operators of the World with 172 million subscribers. In my current role, I lead a team of 35 dynamic individuals who penetrate deep into the market with GSM (Voice, SMS, 2G/3G Internet etc.) and non-GSM (Easy Paise Mobile Wallet Accounts, Tracking Solutions etc.) products. Our Clients consists of an assortment of Small & Medium Enterprises (SME) and Large Corporates (e.g. K-Electric, Engro Foods, House of Habib etc.)

(GU): What competition do you face with other Telecommunication companies?

(I K): With the increase of tele-density in the market and cut throat competition, the market size is getting shorter by the day. And to spice up the proceedings, the general customer demand on the other hand is also becoming more price-intensive where masses are switching operators over meagre tariff differentials. All of this added to the fierce Govt. Regulations for Telcos and planned/unplanned closure of mobile services has condensed the margins for Operators substantially. So overall, the competition in the market is basically geared towards fancy/crowd-pulling ATL adverts and tariff changes.

(GU): What is 3G? And why is it hyped so much?

(I K): 3G is a phenomenal advancement in technology with unlimited features and endless possibilities in the field of mobile internet. Though as a Nation we have delayed the launch of this premium technology for a long time, it will take another few years to actually gain valued advantage from its use. According to a survey, an estimated 3.43 billion people globally depend on mobile services as integral part of their daily lives and these services are actually redefining the way people communicate on a daily basis. There have been major advancements in the field of Medicine and Technology itself with the advent of 3G/4G services the world over. Data allows us to make changes in the industry by allowing to push devices, to push broadband and penetration into mobile applications. 3G opens up many revenue portals for all the Telcos allowing them to commoditize voice.

(GU): What skills are required in your position on a day to day basis?

(I K): As a leader of a team of diversified human beings of different backgrounds, castes and creeds, it is very nec-

essary for a Manager to be inspiring, be respectful, make it easy for others and keep promises and these very genuinely are also the values preached and practiced by our Organization as well. Also, on a professional scale, I am required by my job description of be a good listener, a conflict resolver and a good negotiator.

(G U): What educational preparations would you recommend for someone who wants to advance in this field?

(I K) Well, two things! The first one is a good GPA. It is a myth that GPA does not matter in professional life, well it does! It would not matter when it is your third or fourth job because then one's CV represents the reputation but in first two jobs it matters a lot as the employer has no yardstick to measure your talent so he/she fully relies on your GPA.

And secondly, extra curriculum activities are very important. I realized it when I started working, the employers really prefer those who were in any sort of extra

curriculum activities. For example captains of sports teams or heads of debate teams are considered to possess leadership qualities and are assumedly better at conflict resolution.

(G U): Your one weakness and one strength?

(I K) I am a very softhearted person so, I tend to give people more time than usual to sort themselves out and sometimes people take advantage of this. This is my weakness. And my strength is that I am not a political person, I am a very straightforward person, I do not care about the repercussions, and I never sugarcoat.

(G U): Could you please tell us about your family life?

(I K) Family life is very challenging because me and my wife work full time. We only get to see our children after we come home from work. We try very hard on their education. Our lifestyle has become a bit western, meaning, we work the entire week but we utilize our weekends as we try to coverup for the days we were not fully available. We take kids to parks, for breakfast and lunch, to malls, and if we plan on staying at home then we watch a cartoon together or play video games as me and my eldest son love playing them.

(G U): What has Greenwich University given you?

(I K) Well, besides education, it has given me confidence. The confidence given by Greenwich University has proven to be quite handy. It has enabled me to face challenges of the corporate sector. Thanks to our faculty because they are the only ones who taught us how to speak in front of people without hesitation. ❖



Dr. Abdul Quadir Mughal born on January 7, 1944, is a Research Professor at Greenwich University. He was previously Pro-Vice Chancellor and Vice Chancellor, of Sindh Agriculture University, Tandojam. He is the first Professor Emeritus of the Agriculture University. Before his appointment as Vice Chancellor, he was serving as Advisor, COMSATS Institute of Information Technology (CIIT) Islamabad since 2004. He has also served as Advisor (P&D), Advisor (Academics), Member (WT) and Chairman of the erstwhile University Grants Commission of Pakistan; and as Executive Director of the Higher Education Commission of Pakistan. Dr. Mughal has received a high quality education from the most prestigious international institutions. Dr. A. Q. Mughal graduated from University of Sindh in 1966 and received M.Sc. Honors in 1970. He also received M.S. degree from the American University of Beirut, Lebanon in 1975. In 1979, Dr. Mughal was awarded World Bank Fellowship. Under this program he earned Ph.D. from the Cranfield Institute of Technology, UK in 1983. Dr. Mughal also won the Fulbright Research Award in 1989 for post-doctoral research at the Iowa State University, Ames, Iowa, USA.

Dr. Mughal has acquired professional experience by attending national and international conferences,





Dr. Mughal possesses rich experience of 47 years (BPS 17 to 22) in the administration and teaching of higher education, basic and adaptive research, and planning and appraisal of research & development projects. Two models: 'Clinic-Hospital system for back-up service for farm machinery' and 'An approach to small holder mechanization research and development in Pakistan' are already to his credit. His experience, as a Visiting Scientist at the National Soil Tilth Laboratory USA, working on the development of a Soil Tilth Index and its use in examining the energy efficiency of tillage systems, is getting significance all over the world. On this research, he has been honored with US-1993 '**Exceptional Merit Paper Award**'. Dr. Mughal has also been recognized by '**Who is Who in the World**'. He was elected Vice President of the Executive Council of Federation of Universities of Islamic World in 2009.

Dr. Mughal has also worked as Dean of Agricultural Engineering Faculty for over four years (March '86-August '89 and June'94 to Nov.'95). planning and execution of agricultural projects in Sindh province. He has served as Chairman and Member on various management bodies of the University. He has also served on the Executive Council of Pakistan Society of Agricultural Engineers and Pakistan Engineering Council. Dr. Mughal fully participated in preparing the ‘**Education Policy 1998-2010**’ and was a Member of the ‘**Task Force on Improvement of Higher Education in Pakistan**’ constituted by the Government of Pakistan in 2001, which resulted in the establishment of Higher Education Commission of Pakistan.

Ms. Ayesha Leghari is a communications expert with nearly ten years of experience in implementing communications strategies, especially for the nonprofit and health sectors. In her current role she is serving as social and behavior change communication advisor to Greenstar Social Marketing and is employed by Greenstar’s affiliate Population Services International. She is also heading the newly formed Behavior Change Communication and Corporate communication department at Greenstar. Prior to this she was serving as the Deputy General Manager for Behavior Change Communication for PSI’s USAID funded Maternal and Child Health program in Pakistan, Ms. Leghari led the Health communications component of the program and managed the development of mass media, mid media, and interpersonal communication campaigns. She was responsible for overseeing the testing and production of the campaigns, which bring family planning and healthy maternal and child health behavior messaging to women of reproductive age and their influencers, while maintaining relationships with the

Government of Sindh and the Department of Health. Prior to working for PSI, Ms. Leghari was the head of marketing and communications for the Aman Foundation’s healthcare services and she oversaw all communications activities for 5 (five) different brands while managing partnerships with public and private sectors. While serving as the Associate Director of Business Development for the Nay Jeevan Welfare Organization, Ms. Leghari managed and developed the marketing strategies that lead to the tripling in number of beneficiaries signed up for insurance and a ten-fold increase in potential clients. Ms. Leghari managed the communications strategies and brand management for Airwaves Media (TV One, NewsOne, Radio1 FM 91 and Waseb TV), a television and radio company, and Taxpulse. Ms. Leghari received both her Masters of Business Administration in Marketing and a Bachelors of Science from Greenwich University in Karachi, Pakistan with distinctions and holds **Gold Medal** in Masters of Business Administration.



Greenwich University (GU): Could you please enlighten us with more information of your business and the nature of your job?

Ayesha Leghari (A L): I am currently working for Greenstar as the head of social and behaviour change communication department, it is a new phenomenon and it is quite similar to what commercial organisations do in terms of marketing. And as the name simple indicates, the role is to change the mindset of individuals and it is not just to adopt a particular product but also how to live a healthy life. The nature of the business is family planning, birth spacing, and mother and child's health.

(GU): What is Greenstar? When and how did it start?

(A L): Greenstar works through the private sector and with the Government of Pakistan, to inform and empower people and improve access to quality, affordable health products and services. The focal point of all Greenstar's efforts is "Sitara" – the Pakistani woman with a need for healthcare. We work towards helping "Sitara" meet her health needs, and those of her family.

In Pakistan 25% of married women have an unmet need for family planning. Maternal mortality remains high, at an estimated 276 deaths per 100,000 live births. Infant mortality remains at 78 deaths per 1000 live births 1.

In order to help meet this gap in provision of health services, Greenstar offers a range of over 20 socially marketed products and services for family planning, reproductive health, mother and child health, tuberculosis, nutritional supplements for children and safe water. Greenstar's products are distributed through a nation-wide network of over 7000 franchised clinics, 75,000 retail outlets and community based distribution. The private sector social franchise health outlets are strengthened by Greenstar's training and health services team, which enhances skills of service providers and quality of services.



Recently, Greenstar has partnered with the public sector and donor agencies to implement voucher schemes, which provide subsidized access to institutionalized health care for mothers. The long-term goal of integrating maternal health and family planning initiatives is to increase access points for the provision of information and uptake of services.

At Greenstar we believe that as we meet the health needs of "Sitara", we meet the needs of a nation.

(GU):What is the vision and mission of Greenstar?

(A L): Our Vision

Greenstar envisions a Pakistan where people plan their families and have improved maternal and child health and reduced tuberculosis burden. Greenstar aims to be an organization of competent professionals, passionate about improving the lives of people in Pakistan.

Our Mission

To improve the quality of life of low-income people throughout Pakistan by increasing access to and use of health products, services, and information.

(GU):Who is Ayesha Leghari in personal life?

(A L): I am mother of two boys, my personal life is dedicated to my children, and it revolves around them. During the day hours I'm completely professional, but as soon as I reach home, my role completely transforms into being a mother. I help my sons with their homework and try to spend quality time with them.

(GU): Tell us about your childhood, how was it different?

(A L): My childhood was very conventional; my father





was a bureaucrat so I moved from city to city after almost every three years, which led me to make friends in every part of this country. I was the only sister of two older brothers, so my childhood was quite boyish.

(GU): How do you involve and motivate your staff when an important company's strategic decision is needed to be made?

(A L): My strategy is to take them along, at times strategies are not trickled down to the second-tier or the third-tier, but I try to involve them. I sit with my team and we brainstorm, then we place our thoughts randomly somewhere on my room's door/window on sticky notes and then we try to organise them. So in that way, they are involved in the decision making process.

(GU): If you get a second chance to study, would you join any other institute, which one would you choose and why?

(A L): If I'm to re-select any field, it would not be any other but marketing and the institute would be no other but Greenwich University. And Greenwich University is one of the leaders in the field of communication.

(GU): What are the essential tools for an effective communication?

(A L): I think one of the most basic mistake that we make while developing any communication material or any communication message is that we tend to put out perceived opinions and perceived knowledge into the commercial campaign that we are developing, we will not really focus on the consumer's insight and we assume our target audience to think in a particular manner, and we apply all our strategies revolving around that particular thought. So I think, one of the most important tool is consumer's insight.

(GU): What is your perception of Greenwich University?

(A L): My perception of Greenwich University is very strong, I think I am who I am, is because of Greenwich University. There is not a single platform where I have not been appraised, be it an International platform or wherever I have been appraised, I have always mentioned that my grooming has come from Greenwich University.

(GU): Would you like to share some memories from Greenwich University that are close to your heart?

(A L): Sure! I got engaged while I was still studying in Greenwich University, I met my soulmate there only. There is another cherished memory that I have, I received a Gold Medal during my convocation and my son was six months old, I walked down the aisle wearing that medal and later putting it on my son. I still have a picture from that day and it's framed on a wall in my house.

(GU): How would you define your stay at Greenwich University?

(A L): Phenomenal! If it is to be concluded in one word, whatever I have learnt at Greenwich University has contributed substantially towards my success in my professional life. ❖






Rotaract Club Acknowledging Ceremony





Prior to joining AKU-IED (between 1989 and 1993), he served as Chief Executive Officer of the Agha Khan Education Service, Pakistan. Dr Pardhan was born in Kenya, where he completed his high school level studies. He did his PhD in Chemistry from Uppsala University, Sweden, and studied for a postgraduate Diploma in Education from the same university. His teaching subjects were chemistry, physics and mathematics. He was the Principal Lecturer (first one appointed by the Kenyan Government) at the Kenya Science Teachers College. From 1969 to 1979, he was the Deputy Principal of Kenya Teacher's College in Nairobi, Kenya. During that period, besides teaching and teacher education, he was involved in curriculum planning and development, evaluation at the national level, and materials development.

Dr Pardhan has many published articles to his credit. He has also written a number of educational reports, books and manuals.

The impact of this informative workshop was excellent. Teachers' feedback was amazing as they felt they learned a lot from this session which could be useful for them in their professional life.

More than 100 people attended this workshop from different educational institutes. The session was a great success for all, as most of the attendees found the session quite fruitful and were completely satisfied.


