Pakistan's standing in the global rankings

Overview

Pakistan observed a slight improvement in the overall international rankings in 2018 covering socio-economic and political outcomes of the country. Several elements complemented the prospects including successful democratic transition, efficient counter-terrorism measures leading to enhanced peace and security, and foreign direct investment inflows under CPEC, among others. Albeit, deccupling economic growth from human development suggests that the tinch to enhance its scores in health, education and standard of living by ensuring political will, equitable financing and efficient governance to ensure parallel growth for marginalized segments as well. Civil and political liberties must grow hand in hand to ensure a conducive environment for democratic dialogue and accountability which ultimately supports its nation building process.

DEMOCRACY INDEX

Pakistan ranked 112th out of 167 countries in the Democracy Index scoring 4.17 out of 10 in 2018 compared to 4.26 in 2017.

Index from 0 (authoritarian regime) to 10 (full democracy)

Compiled based on indicators covering: Electoral process and pluralism, Civil liberties, Functioning of government, Political participation, and Political culture.

HUMAN DEVELOPMENT INDEX

Pakistan ranked 150th out of 189 countries in the Human Development Index scoring 0.562 out of 1.000 in 2018 compared to 0.560 out of 1.000 in 2017.










Nation celebrated Quaid-e-Azam's Birth Anniversary

ADB, Pakistan sign \$1.3 billion loan agreement

sian Development Bank (ADB) and Pakistan on Monday struck a loan agreement of \$1.3 billion for budgetary support and reforms of the country. This will help stabilise the foreign exchange reserves of the country, and strengthen Pakistan's slowing economy. Federal Minister for Economic Affairs Hammad Azhar was present on the occasion, while Economic Affairs Division Secretary Syed Pervaiz Abbas and ADB Country Director Xiahong

Yang signed the agreement, according to a press release. Under the agreement, ADB has committed to providing \$1 billion towards the Economic Stabilization Program which aims to improve exchange rate management, strengthen public financial management, restore allocative efficiency of scarce public resources and reduce the social impacts of macroeconomic stability measures, said the press release. Out of the total \$1.3 billion loan, \$300 million have been earmarked for reforms in the energy sector and the Financial Stability Programme. This aims to address energy shortfalls as well as policy related shortcomings in the country's energy sector. The Govt of Pak & ADB have scaled up their partnership today with the

signing of USD 1 Bn special policy-based loan for macro-economic stability and USD 300 ml for energy sector and financial sector reforms. However, agriculture is expected to recover from weather-induced contraction this year with major incentives in the government's agriculture support package included in the budget for FY2O2O.The ADB is

committed to achieving a prosperous, inclusive, resilient, and sustainable Asia and the Pacific, while sustaining its efforts to eradicate extreme poverty. In 2018, it made commitments of new loans and grants amounting to \$21.6 billion. Established in 1966, it is owned by 68 members – 49 from the region. **Dawn**



Ecnec approves seven development projects

The Executive committee of the National Economic Council (ECNEC) on Monday approved seven de-

vision of infrastructure such as water supply, irrigation, access roads, sanitation and drainage facilities to the popwith the use of IT services. The "Pakistan Multi Mission Communication satellite system (PakSat-MMI) project"



velopment projects worth Rs216.4 billion that related to poverty alleviation, education, hydropower project and others. Adviser to the Prime Minister on Revenue and Finance Dr Abdul Hafeez Shaikh chaired the meeting of the ECNEC. The ECNEC considered and approved seven projects put forth by Ministry of Planning, Development and Special Initiatives. ECNEC considered and approved the Southern Punjab Poverty Alleviation Project (SPPAP)-IFAD assisted, Revised-III at the total cost of Rs15.52 billion with Rs 7.5 billion as the FEC.

Government of Punjab and the International Fund for Agricultural Development are the financers of the project and the aim of the project is to contribute to reduction of poverty in the Southern Punjab Region through improving the living standards of the people, boosting agricultural production and pro-

ulation.

The project is expected to be complete by 2023. It was briefed to the ECNEC that the main cause of the revision in the cost of the project was the change in the exchange rate. ECNEC also gave approval to "Higher Education Development in Pakistan" (HEDP) Islamabad, at the total cost of Rs12.08 billion with FEC of Rs 7.72 billion to be provided by World Bank IDA Financing. The project has five components; Nurturing academic excellence in strategic sectors, supporting decentralized Higher Education Institutes for improved teaching and learning, equipping students and **Higher Education Institutions** with modern technology, Higher Education Management Information System and Data driven services and technical assistance. The project is expected to raise the overall quality of Higher Education in the country

for the establishment of the Geostationary Communication Satellite and its ground control stations located inside Pakistan, cohosted with the PakSat-IR ground control equipment also got approval by ECNEC at the total cost of Rs 39.7 billion. 15% of the cost of the project shall be finance through Federal PSDP and 85% shall be Chinese Concessional Loan. The project aims to help in increasing mobile density, tele density, broadband internet density, employment generation and quick to establish means of communication over a large geographical area stretching beyond national borders. The project shall complete in 44 months.

ECNEC approved the Terbela 4th Extension Hydropower project Revised PC I, at the total cost of Rs122.9 billion. The objective of the project is the expansion of the present capacity of Terbela Dam Hydro Power Project from

3478 MW to 4888 MW (addition of 1410 MW) by installation of three units of 470 MW on the existing irrigation tunnel 4. World Bank IBRD/IDA shall be providing 90% of the financing of the project (US\$692 million) and 10% of the financing shall be done by WAPDA's own resources. The Project is located at Swabi and Haripur Districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

The renewable Energy Development Sector Investment Program (3rd Revised) also got approval by ECNEC at the total cost of Rs12.8 billion with Rs 8.84 billion as FEC. The project shall be sponsored by the Government of Punjab with the financial assistance of Asian Development Bank (ADB).

Deg-Outfall (4.04 MW) and Pakpattan (2.82 MW) at Can-The "Evacuation of Power from Wind power projects at Jhimpir and Gharo Wind Clusters" Revised PC-I at the total cost of Rs13.40 billion was also approved by ECNEC. The National Transmission & Despatch Company Ltd. (NTDC) will be the Executing Agency. The main objective of the project is evacuation of 1256 MW power from the Wind Power Plants (WPPs) installed at Jhimpir and Gharo wind clusters for supply of power to respective load centers of DISCO i.e. HESCO through transmission network of NTDC system. The Project shall be financed by KfW (27 million Euros) and NTDC's own resources. The expected time for the completion of the project is 33 months.

While Pakistani weightlifters Talha Talib, Usman Rathore, Muhammad Hanzala Dastgir and Nooh Butt showed impressive skills and won four gold medals. Judoka Hamid Ali, playing in +100kg weight category, won all the league matches against India, Nepal, Bangladesh, Bhutan and Sri Lanka to grab gold medal. Shah Hussain Shah is all set to represent the country in 2020 Tokyo Olympics, as he won all the league matches against India, Nepal, Bangladesh, Bhutan and Sri Lanka with full points to clinch gold in -100kg. He just consumed less than 10 seconds against all opponents in all the fights.

In-90kg judo, Qaiser Khan won silver medal as he lost the final against India. Bisma Khan won silver medal in swimming, Sanaullah got silver in boxing, as he lost the final against Indi-

an boxer, Muhammad Husnain, Beenish Khans, Humaira Ashig and Amina Toyoda earned bronze medals. Talking to The Nation, Pakistan Judo Federation (PJF) President Col (R) Junaid Alam said: "I was sure that we had golden chances of excelling in Nepal, but I don't know on what grounds, we were almost deprived of representing the country in 13th SAG. I am grateful to IPC Minister Dr Fehmida Mirza, who came to rescue us, as if she hadn't taken personal interest and ordered to ensure judokas participation in Nepal, the Dr Fehmida will continue to lend a helping hand to us and in return, our athletes win glories for the country," he added.

In squash team event, Pakistan got off to flying start and beat hosts Nepal, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh, while Pakistani women team beat Sri Lanka 2-1. In the men's first match against Nepal, Farhan Mehboob beat Simha Arhanta 3-0 in 18 minutes, as he won the first game 11-7, second 11-5 and third 11-3. Asim Khan beat Magar Amrit Thapa 3-0 in 17 minutes, winning 11-5, 11-4 and 11-5,



Sumon Md 3-0 in 20 minutes, winning 11-8, 11-9 and 11-9, Asim Khan beat Raju Sri Kumar 3-0 in 14 minutes, winning 11-8. 11-1 and 11-1 and Farhan Mehboob beat Debnath Runny 3-0 in 17 minutes, winning 11-4, 11-2 and 11-3. Pakistani women beat Sri Lanka 2-1. Faiza Zafar beat Issadeen Fathoum 3-1 in 40 minutes, as she lost the first game 5-11, before winning next three games 11-8, 11-9 and 11-5 to give Pakistan 1-0 lead. Her younger sister Madina Zafar hammered Karuppu Yeheni 3-0 in 20 minutes, winning 11-1, 11-2 and 11-6 to give Pakistan an unassailable 2-0 lead, while in the third and dead rubber, Amna Pakistan stand on number four with 32 gold medals, 37 silver, 55 bronze and total 124 medals. IPC Minister Dr Fehmida Mirza congratulated the medal winners and promised to provide them more facilities, so that they may train harder and win more laurels for their country in international events.
